At the September 2025 Board of Directors Meeting, adjustments were approved as Rev. Bobby and Rev. Domenichelli have returned from mission service and Ms. Makia Adler (Belize) has entered mission service. Offerings are now designated to Rev. Jastram, Rev. Andreasen, and Ms. Adler.

Luke 10, but Make it Travel-Size




Just a few of the friends I have had the pleasure of staying with





SOUTH DAKOTA DISTRICT LCMS UNRESTRICTED BUDGET OF EXPENSES


